<b>Forest Activity (225 points)</b>			
All forest (either existing or to be established) must be preserved in perpetuity as forestland			
<b>3.</b>	<b>Forest Preservation</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 1 point per 25 acres for the permanent protection of existing forest.</li> </ul>	<b>125</b>	
<b>4.</b>	<b>Forest Restoration</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 2 points per acre to create new permanent forest. Potential components include: planting plan, species list, management plan.</li> </ul>	<b>50</b>	
<b>5.</b>	<b>Forest Enhancement</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 0.5 points for each forested acre that provides durable restoration or enhancement. This can be shown through plan of work, proposed easement restrictions, or through evaluation of the forest management plan. Potential components include: native species conversion tree planting, controlled burning, management of invasives, etc.</li> </ul>	<b>50</b>	
<b>Forest Quality (125 points)</b>			
<b>6.</b>	<b>Project Will Permanently Protect Forestland That Is High Conservation Value (FCV4 and FCV5)</b> VDOF Forest Conservation Value: based on water quality, site productivity, terrestrial & aquatic habitat, intactness, and threat to conversion attributes Scoring from high to low: FCV5 - FCV1  <b>OR</b> <b>Project Will Permanently Protect Forestland That Has High Ecological Integrity Scoring (C1, Outstanding and C2, Very High)</b> Proximity to DCR-NH's 2017 VaNLA Ecological Cores: based on biodiversity, habitats, and ecosystem functions. Scoring from high to low: C1 - C5 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 125 points if all or part of a FCV4 or FCV5 or if all or part of a C1 (outstanding) or C2 (very high) core or if adding new forest adjacent to one of these areas</li> <li>▪ 100 points if all or part of a FCV3, FCV2, FCV1 or C3, C4, or C5 core or if adding new forest adjacent to one of these areas</li> <li>▪ 0 points if not part of or immediately adjacent to any scoring (no FCV or C value assigned)</li> </ul>	<b>125</b>

<b>7.</b>	<b>Length of Stream Through Permanently Protected Forest (Existing or Planned)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 0.5 point per 500 linear feet of intermittent or perennial stream or river.</li> </ul>	<b>5</b>	
<b>8.</b>	<b>Area of Wetland in Permanently Protected Forest (Existing or Planned)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 0.5 point per 0.10 acre of wetland contained within.</li> </ul>	<b>5</b>	

9.	<b>Presence of Natural Heritage Rare Species and Rare Communities</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 10 points for presence of a significant natural heritage forest community element occurrence</li> <li>▪ 8 points for B1 &amp; B2 Heritage rating</li> <li>▪ 5 points for B3, B4 &amp; B5 Heritage rating or presence of a T&amp;E forest plant or insect</li> <li>▪ 3 points for adjacency to a property with B1-B5 Heritage rating or with a T&amp;E forest plant or insect</li> <li>▪ 0 points for no rating (not in a natural heritage conservation site), or no presence of T&amp;E forest plant or insect, and no adjacent properties with such values</li> </ul>	<b>10</b>	
10.	<b>Presence of VDGIF Species</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 5 points for T&amp;E animal or Tier I SGCN (not also listed as T&amp;E)</li> <li>▪ 3 points for Tier II SGCN</li> <li>▪ 2 points for adjacency to a property with T&amp;E animal or a Tier I or II SGCN</li> <li>▪ 0 points for no T&amp;E species/Tier I or II SGCN and no adjacent properties with such values</li> </ul>	<b>5</b>	
11.	<b>Presence of VDGIF Resources</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 5 points T&amp;E water or wild trout stream on site</li> <li>▪ 3 points for tributary of T&amp;E water or wild trout stream</li> <li>▪ 2 points for adjacency to a property with T&amp;E water or wild trout streams or their tributaries on site</li> <li>▪ 0 points for no T&amp;E water or wild trout streams on site, no tributaries to said waters, and no adjacent properties with such values</li> </ul>	<b>5</b>	
<b>Proximity (60 points)</b>			
12.	<b>Adjacency to Parks and Conserved Lands</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 20 points if located adjacent to a permanently conserved forested land</li> <li>▪ 10 points if located adjacent to a permanently conserved non-forested land</li> <li>▪ 0 points for no adjacency to permanently conserved land</li> </ul>	<b>20</b>	
13.	<b>Proximity to Impact</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 15 points if within 15 miles of pipeline</li> <li>▪ 10 points if within 30 miles of pipeline</li> <li>▪ 5 points if within 50 miles from pipeline</li> <li>▪ 0 points if over 50 miles from pipeline</li> </ul>	<b>15</b>	
14.	<b>Watershed Location</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Within impacted watershed (8-digit hydrologic unit)</li> </ul>	<b>10</b>	
15.	<b>Serves a County Impacted by Pipeline</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 15 points for projects located in county impacted by pipeline</li> <li>▪ 0 points for projects located in county not impacted by pipeline</li> </ul>	<b>15</b>	
<b>Public Access/Recreation Value (30 points)</b>			
16.	<b>Public Access</b> Proposed use must not degrade the forest ecosystem <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 15 points for 100% of the year</li> <li>▪ 10 points for &gt; 50% of the year</li> <li>▪ 5 points for &lt; 50% of the year</li> <li>▪ 0 points for no public access provided or planned degrading activity</li> </ul>	<b>15</b>	

<b>17.</b>	<b>Scenic Resources Protection</b> Protects forested locally significant viewsheds, forested scenic viewsheds or land important to the protection of any federally designated Wild and Scenic River or American Heritage River in/or adjacent to Virginia, Virginia's Scenic Rivers, designated Scenic Roads, Virginia Byways, and/or recreational trails including greenways & blueways <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 15 points for conserved land in direct viewshed of one of the listed resources</li> <li>▪ 10 points for conserved land in direct viewshed of a resource identified in VOP</li> <li>▪ 5 points for conserved land in direct viewshed of a public thoroughfare (e.g. visible from roads/rivers not designated scenic)</li> </ul>	<b>15</b>	
<b>Alignment with State, Local, Community, and Regional Plans &amp; Goals (10 points)</b>			
<b>18.</b>	<b>State Goals/Plans</b> Project in alignment with Virginia Outdoors Plan (Current Draft Plan), Wildlife Action Plan (2015), or Natural Heritage Need (Current Draft Plan) <i>Page number must be specified</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 5 points if needs of all plans are met</li> <li>▪ 3 points if needs of two plans are met</li> <li>▪ 1 point if needs of one plan is met</li> <li>▪ 0 points if not identified in either plan</li> </ul>	<b>5</b>	
<b>19.</b>	<b>Local/Community/Regional Plans</b> Supports local and/or regional comprehensive plan for parks, open space, and recreational facilities, and/or contributes to the protection of a state, regionally, or locally identified conservation corridor. <i>Plan name &amp; page number must be cited. If not supported by text of comprehensive plan, a letter from locality showing the interpretation of plan does support proposal must be submitted.</i> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 5 points if identified in local comprehensive or regional plans or if letter of support from locality based on plan interpretation provided</li> <li>▪ 0 points if not identified in or not in conformity with any plan and no letter of support from locality provided</li> </ul>	<b>5</b>	
<b>Community Needs (20 points)</b>			
<b>20.</b>	<b>Community Support</b> Community support may be shown through support letters from conservation groups, land trusts, or resolutions from localities. Additional consideration should be given to the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Community connection to forest (geographic as well as cultural)</li> <li>▪ Educational component on forest ecosystem services</li> <li>▪ Community need for forest protection</li> <li>▪ Ability to aid in community healing process</li> </ul>	<b>20</b>	
<b>Opportunity for Success (20 points)</b>			
<b>21.</b>	<b>Ability of Applicant to Complete/Uphold</b> Applicant has demonstrated organizational and financial capacity to ensure appropriate long-term stewardship of the property <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 10 points for documented financial and organizational capacity to conserve property in perpetuity</li> <li>▪ 5 points for documented financial capacity to conserve property in perpetuity</li> <li>▪ 1 point for limited financial capacity to conserve property in perpetuity</li> </ul>	<b>10</b>	

<b>22.</b>	<b>Project Readiness</b> Readiness shown via landowner letter of intent, completed survey, title reports, appraisal, approved contract of sale, draft easement, etc. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 10 points for very ready</li> <li>▪ 5 points for ready</li> <li>▪ 1 point for pending</li> </ul>	<b>10</b>	
<b>Conservation Efficiency Factor (20 points)</b>			
<b>23.</b>	<b>Ratio of Match</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ 20 points for 80% or more of the total project cost</li> <li>▪ 15 points for 60% or more of total project cost</li> <li>▪ 10 points for 50% or more of the total project cost</li> <li>▪ 5 points for 30% or more of the total project cost</li> </ul>	<b>20</b>
